## HEARING GOD'S HEART FOR INDIA

In New Delhi, India, **GMTA** (Genesis Media Training Association) broadcasts a weekly National Radio Program and runs medical camps on the Delhi outskirts. They also train program writers and oversee the production of 15 Indian language programs for HCJB Australia to broadcast via shortwave across the Asia/Pacific. They are HCJB Australia's **major program partner**.

Listeners in India respond to GMTA's FM and shortwave programs with thousands of emails, letters, phone calls and SMS texts that testify to the impact Dolly and Christopher and their Indian producers are having – so many changed outlooks and lives!

On Monday July 4, **Dolly** (GMTA's Programing and Training Director) and **Christopher** (GMTA's CEO and Engineering Director) flew to Darwin.

They were joined there by **Dale Stagg** (HCJB Australia CEO) and **Derek Kickbush** (HCJB Australia Program Manager and HCJB Asia Pacific Training Director) and arrived in Kununurra Wednesday 6th to begin a **two month ministry tour of Australia and New Zealand**. What a thrill it was for Dolly and Christopher, not only to see the current transmitters and antenna that carries their program back

to India, but to walk among the new towers equipped with much bigger antennas that will deliver even better signals. Their site tour was conducted by Kununurra Manager, **Peter Michalke**, after which around 100 people attended a special dinner where the Kirubakarans shared about their ministries in India.

From Kununurra, they flew to Perth where they were ably looked after by HCJB representatives **Gordon and Margaret Smith** as they shared at many meetings over two weeks. They traveled on to many profitable meetings in Melbourne, Queensland and Sydney, then flew to New Zealand on August 15th. One of the highlights of their tour was going **live on air to India directly from our Kilsyth Studios**. They are raising awareness of their ministries in India, the impact they are having, the need for funding and also of their partnership with HCJB Australia.

# EXCITING NEWS FROM KUNUNURRA, WESTERN AUSTRALIA!

The Kununurra excursion with the Kirubakarans (page 1) was a wonderful opportunity to see the enormous development on our new broadcast site. Technical project leader, **Steve Sutherland**, is confident we will be broadcasting from it by November.

Three towers were erected this year; the long-awaited high tension power line was installed and connected in July. **Next project? Antenna Curtain screens**, assembled on the ground with the aid of work-gloves and lashings of sunscreen. By November, four of the planned seven antennas will be completed and at least one transmitter will shift to its new operational home. This means that hopefully all the completed antennas and transmitters can be **connected and working this year!**

Kununurra staff and volunteers pushed to get as much outdoor work as possible finished during the cool, dry winter months. Volunteers visiting at this time of year are invaluable, not only in the work they accomplish, but as surrogate grandparents for children on site.

A third 100KW transmitter undergoing refurbishment at the HCJB Technology Centre in Elkhart, Indiana, USA, is expected to be delivered in the first quarter of 2012 and will be capable of both analogue and digital shortwave broadcasting.

During that time, he returned to industry for five years to gain further experience.

Married to Barbara, they have two adult children. They worship at Bracken Ridge Baptist Church and have been doing so for about 25 years. Ken is involved in home group leadership, music and technical areas.

As HCJB Australia's Frequency Manager, Ken attends the HFCCC (High Frequency Coordination Conference Conference) twice a year, where he negotiates the frequencies and times for broadcasting we require. # JESUS AT WORK IN HAITI THROUGH HCJB AND SAMARITAN'S PURSE

## Intravenous Line Begins Patients' Paths to Relationship with Christ

A cacophony of sirens, bulldozers and flapping tarp walls welcomed three male patients delivered to the Cholera Treatment Center (CTC), operated by Samaritan's Purse (SP) at Cité Soliel, Haiti — a facility with a reputation for turning death to life through prayer and an intravenous (I.V.) line. Tall, under-weight, severely dehydrated, the men are laid in the triage tent. Immediately I.V.s are started (in both arms for one already near death). All three receive large infusions, called boluses, of saline solution.

The CTC offers rudimentary life-saving care but not the luxury of lab tests or x-rays. Five female Ecuadorians had travelled to Haiti with an HCJB Global Hands team lead by Dr. Richard Douce, an infectious diseases specialist and medical director at Hospital Vozandes-Quito.

Over 19,000 patients were treated since the CTC opened with the onset of cholera late 2010. Mortality has been 0.7%. Other organizations reported mortality rates of 2% to 5% throughout the epidemic.

Orellana, one of the Ecuadorians, talked earnestly with the men being healed. A miracle had occurred, she told them. Would they now consider praying to receive Jesus? A commitment to Christ would mean denouncing voodoo practices to manipulate spiritual powers. Two of them prayed to receive Christ. Haitian chaplains followed up with thorough explanations of what it means to be a Christian.

Saline solutions were coupled with the spiritual component vital to complete healing. Orellana credits principles learned while studying "The Saline Solution" in Quito. The study by U.S. physician, Dr. Walt Larimore, encourages healthcare professionals toward spiritual conversations that he says patients desire of their physicians, but don't know how to initiate. Dr. Larimore serves as an HCJB Global board member.

More Ecuadorians are preparing for cross cultural work through *Corrientes* (Spanish for *Currents*), a mentoring program that HCJB Global and other agencies established with Ecuadorian churches.

During this team's July 5-19 trip to Haiti, patient numbers steadily declined to single digits. Then SP closed the facility, referring new patients elsewhere. At a closing ceremony, a Haitian pastor led the CTC's national staff in singing Creole hymns. After prayer, Justin Dennery (registered nurse and SP Medical Program Director) told the story of the good Samaritan. Dennery told national staff they had served as good Samaritans in the Cité Soliel community. "You carried the sick; you gave medicines; you held the babies. It was you that saved thousands of lives. You have showed Cité Soliel love. This has been the best year of my life."



# LYNDAL MAXWELL UPDATE

Lyndal Maxwell, a Queensland girl and HCJB Australia missionary, who has been visiting Australia, is now back at the Diospi Suyana Hospital in Curahuasi, Peru, serving the indigenous population there. Please pray for her as she tends to her duties as a radiologist, serves on the hospital Board, ministers to locals and trains them in ministry, runs kids clubs and cares for six orphans in her tiny home.
